# 8d Community & Growth

**2021 Credo:** CSLT inspires spiritual expression in community with all and offers an accepting, loving, and peaceful way of living a joyful, healthier, and more abundant life. (We kept the 2020 Credo.)

**CSLT Community Presence**: The recordings of our online Service continue to be viewed on YouTube. During December there were 134 views for 14.7 hours (about normal) and 91 total subscribers (increase of 3). When we get to 100 subscribers, we receive our own unique, and identifiable, YouTube webaddress. Have you subscribed?

The two videos most watched were normal services on December 26<sup>th</sup> and January 2nd. People continue to watch longer on average.

Instagram: We have 67 Instagram followers. Mariann (Moery) is figuring out how to do useful, fun and informative Instagram uploads with the least amount of angst and hassle.

**Newsletter Statistics**: Five newsletters were sent during December to between 512-526 subscribers. Between 214-261 people (42-50%) opened them, and 20-36% of those who opened them clicked on something for further reading. These are truly excellent readership and participation response.

**Morning Meditation**. Daily practice continues, and a Sunday morning practice has been added. The current leaders have agreed to continue the daily morning practice through March 2022. We know that those participating get good value from the practice, and we/they are open to having others join in as they feel intrigued and called.

**8e Covid 19** We make headway on beginning to have in-person services at a local theater. (We are in contract discussions with them.) They have stringent, protective protocols which we will abide by. As a new facility, built during the pandemic, they have the volume and quality of air handlers which will reduce risks to humans. We will be following their physical distancing protocols & masking while inside. We augment their practices with color-coded nametags (green = hugs ok, yellow = ask me first, red = no contact).

# **8f Small Groups**

The men's group meets online 1st & 3rd Thursdays for breakfast, with 6-8 attending. We have participants in the men's group that attend other churches and spiritual centers. Awesome!

Prosperity+ Alums, with 4-5 attending meets online, 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays 1-2pm in our second zoom room. New graduates invited to participate.

Keith Gorley has determined that his next class in his zoom room will begin February 16<sup>th</sup> (Wednesdays) 4-5:30pm on Eric Butterworth's *Practical Metaphysics*. Books are available at our bookstore.

Janet Salese hosts Full Moon Labyrinth Walk as a regular activity for which we advertise and encourage participation of those interested.

December's walk was combined with one of our two solstice celebrations on the 18<sup>th</sup>. The Full Moon Labyrinth Walk after the Solstice celebration on December 18. 13 ppl attended. January's walk had 3 attendees.

We will be hosting in-person training with four members of our extended leadership team and the identified person(s) from the theater company, both to understand the operations of the equipment, and how to use it in this new space.

# 8j. CSL Member Council Meeting - (Madeline)

<u>December's report</u>: 74 participants including Santa. Edward Viljoen & David Alexander lead the meeting. Detra Johnson spoke about one resolution. For a member to serve in a leadership role with home office, the education requirement was a minimum of 75 certificated class hours. It is now changed to 40 certificated class hours. The requirement that the member show a minimum of 1 year financial support to their local center, and 3 years as a registered member of their center, has not changed and still is a requirement. Members are encouraged to support the growth of our centers organization.

David Alexander introduced of the recent transitional director and read her resume. A company named 3<sup>rd</sup> Sector provided CSL Dr. Paula Gable on contract for a minimum of one year as our transitional director. She spoke about CSL as having strong wise & kind leaderships throughout CSL feeling our organization is in very good hands. She wants to strengthen our on-line presence. She lives 2 miles from Mile Hi.

We are still planning on purchasing the camp although it is not finalized yet. We have received over a million in donations and it will be a positive addition to CSL.

A question was raised as to how centers are doing financially etc. since Covid. 96% of the planned church pledges are still being received at home office.

January's report – There was no member council meeting due to the CSL convention.

- **8k. Spiritual Living Circles Madeline.** Signed up with CSL's spiritual living circles. Will start receiving materials. In discussion with co-host, and starting to make progress on getting established.
- **8I.** Value of small group gatherings (as long as we remain on online only) Maria enjoyed hosting the December 12<sup>th</sup> watch party. 3 person attended. Maria hosted the next one on January 9<sup>th</sup>, with six (including a new person) attending. Janet hosted one on January 23, with 5 attending. Suggest as many watch parties between now when we begin to meet in person to get people used to the idea of gathering in person again.
- **8m.** Leadership Training Opportunities for Board Members Books have been distributed to leadership. Rev Janis has reached out to Dr Jim Lockhard. He's on vacation and has a new book coming out on January, so he's not readily available at the moment.

# **8n.** Recognition of Major Donors – March 19.

Maria: Ramadas are available at Reid park and Ft Lowell Park. Discussion: Ft Lowell park is smaller, close to our old Sunday meeting location, and easier for the caterers, so we decided to reserve a ramada there. Maddy shared the menu choices, etc from the Tasteful Kitchen. The board selected two options which we will offer to the major donors in a 'Thank You/Invitation letter' in early February. We'll need responses by the end of February so the Tasteful Kitchen can prepare the meals.

- **8o.** Report on 2022 charities identified by congregants (Janet/Rev Janis) The congregation elected (voted) to support Old Pueblo Community Services again in 2022.
- **8p. New Sunday Venue** Yahoo!! Janet Salese initiated contact with a local theater. Timing was excellent, they had just started contemplating renting their space when they were not using it. The Board visited and approved of the location on Thursday January 13.

The theater agreed to work with us at our price point, and were willing to provide technical support for lights, sound and livestreaming at a reasonable fee. Our time utilization is reasonably compatible. We have received a draft contract from the theater company. The board discussed the contract at length and came up with questions needing clarification. CSLT Board members are going to sit down with the management of the theater company to see if/how we can iron out these points. We have already transferred our liability policy to the new location and await paperwork from our insurance agent. Provisions have been made to retrieve our gear from The Gregory School, which will happen the week of January 31.

Further details, like expanded music licenses, and training the videographer(s) on our equipment also need to be worked.

- **8q. Prospective Interim Board Members?** Maria contacted one identified qualified member to determine their level of interest in being a 6-month member of the board. No response yet.
- **8r. Community Envisioning Debrief?** Discussion: How do we encourage ownership of the desire to have more fun as a community, or as subsets of the community? One thought was to ask those participating in the directory to augment their individual descriptions with areas of interest, which might encourage individuals to find others with similar interests for social activities.

Another question that wasn't so easily landed was how we encourage attraction/retention of prospective congregants. This may be a deeper question than it originally appears. We have an ever-changing pivot point between individual responsibility and community involvement and support.


