CSLT Online Community Presence:

<u>Website</u>: Clickable icons for Facebook, and Youtube are on <u>tucsoncsl.org</u> website, under Sunday video. Link to Instagram page has been requested of webmaster.

<u>YouTube</u>: The recordings of our online services continue to be viewed on YouTube. There are now 117 subscribers to our site, up from 117. The recording by Dr Karmen on May 29th received the most views so far, with the one on May 15th with Rev Steph St Amand received almost as many. Number of views was up at 187 and viewing time was also up at 19.1 hours.

<u>Instagram</u>: Back up and running. As of this writing, 106 Instagram followers & 30 posts. If posting on Instagram is fun for you, contact the office to join the Instagram team.

Newsletter Statistics: Four newsletters were sent during May to between 520-523 subscribers. Between 257-288 people (50-56%) opened them, and 18-24% of those who opened also clicked on something for further reading. These are truly excellent readership and participation response rates.

Morning Meditation. Daily practice continues, and a Sunday morning practice has been added. The current leaders have agreed to continue the daily morning practice through June 2022. We know that those participating get good value from the practice, and we/they are open to having others join in as they feel intrigued and called. Will stopping meeting on Sundays starting 6/12/2022, but the other days continue.

8e Covid 19 Live Theatre Workshop has stringent, protective protocols which we will abide by. As a new facility, built during the pandemic, they have the volume and quality of air handlers which will reduce risks to humans. We will be following their physical distancing protocols & masking while inside. We augment their practices with color-coded nametags (green = hugs ok, yellow = ask me first, red = no contact, please).

Prosperity+ Alums continue to meet online. For May 2022 the group met on the 2nd and 4th Sundays. Beginning in June will resume 1st and 3rd Sundays 2pm in our second zoom room. New graduates invited to participate. Five people regularly attend. Good results are being achieved.

Janet Salese hosts Full Moon Labyrinth Walk as a regular activity for which we advertise and encourage participation of those interested. Janet led a "Pause for Peace" walk on May 7, National Labyrinth Day (This activity is in collaboration with the Centers for Spiritual Living Heart of Peace initiative) 3 people attended. 8 people got to walk the labyrinth under the Super Flower Red Moon on May 15, then stayed to watch the lunar eclipse until its peak. The June walk had 6 attendees. Janet will ask Shelly to lead group in July. Janet will retain her role as the point of contact for the activity.

The Gregory School has declined to accept our rental payments since May 2020 because the school remains closed to renters, and they have terminated our lease, as of December 2021. We search for a new Sunday meeting location.

The 3rd quarter was a difficult one for the markets and the investment managers worked diligently to minimize losses. We expect the 4th quarter and the year-end performance in late January or February to be much improved, and they were. First quarter results from 2022 moved downward.
