7a 911 S Craycroft facility update

Have contacted an air conditioning company to service our air conditioner. It hasn't been serviced
since we purchased the building (although we have changed the filter). A service tech identified some
necessary repairs on August 11, which are being scheduled. Initial repairs were completed on Aug 25.
A little more work is required, checking ductwork connections in the attic, and sealing the roof around
the air conditioner when it has cooled off.

7b. Live Theater Workshop (LTW) update

- We have a good working relationship with the theater, and things seem to be working out for both of us. They have waived their previous requirement for us to purchase and install a TuffShed for storing our non-electronic equipment and have trained a back-up Sunday video tech.
- The original contract had required us to be virtual on July 31st, but they moved their stage swap-out so we could continue meeting in person on that date. Our next scheduled online-only service is September 4th.
- Seeking to identify zoom co-hosts who can monitor the zoom room, take counts, manage the mute button, and answer or relay questions of zoom participants. (Presently have four.)

8d Community & Growth

Credo: CSLT inspires spiritual expression in community with all and offers an accepting, loving, and peaceful way of living a joyful, healthier, and more abundant life.

CSLT Online Community Presence:

<u>YouTube</u>: The recordings of our online services continue to be viewed on YouTube. We're also livestreaming our complete Sunday service on YouTube (with between 3-8 views for the live service), though we are only recording the talk and prayer, per our previous agreement with the band. There are now 130 subscribers to our site, up from 128. Our most watched service was Sunday, July 10th. The second most watched was July 3rd. Two-thirds of those watching on our YouTube channel are not subscribers. That's cool. <u>Instagram</u>: As of this writing, 111 Instagram followers & 74 posts (as of August 4th). We've uploaded posts for 72 consecutive days. If posting on Instagram is fun for you, contact the office to join the Instagram team.

Newsletter Statistics: Four newsletters were sent during July to between 527-528 subscribers. Between 260-286 people (50-55%) opened them, and 17-23% of those who opened also clicked on something for further reading. These continue to be truly exceptional readership and participation response rates.

Morning Meditation. Daily practice continues. The current leaders have agreed to continue the daily morning practice through September 2022. We know that those participating get good value from the practice, and we/they are open to having others join in as they feel intrigued and called.

8e Covid 19 Live Theatre Workshop has stringent, protective protocols which we abide by. As a new facility, built during the pandemic, they have the volume and quality of air handlers which will reduce risks to humans. We will be following their physical distancing protocols & masking while inside. We augment their practices with color-coded nametags (green = hugs ok, yellow = ask me first, red = no contact, please).

8f Small Groups

Hosts: Pat Masters served as the 5th Sunday host. We are grateful to our hosts, who represent us well to our in person and online community.

Prosperity+ Alums continue to meet online. The group continues to meet 1st and 3rd Sundays 2pm in our second zoom room. New graduates invited to participate. Five people regularly attend. Good results are being achieved.

Janet Salese hosts Full Moon Labyrinth Walk as a regular activity for which we advertise and encourage participation of those interested. The July walk had 7 attendees. The August walk had 11 attendees.

<u>The remaining schedule for 2022</u> is: Aug 11 - 8pm, Sep 10 - 8pm, Oct 9 - 7pm, Nov 8 - 7pm, Dec 7 - 7pm Sacred Cinema — The movie for July was "The Art of Effortless Living, available on YouTube." (A new person joined discussion group, total of 4.) August's movie discussion is cancelled and the September movie will be "Walk with Me" (available on Amazon Prime).

Lunch Bunch has returned. Madeline has agreed to be the point person for a regularly scheduled gathering at Basha's food court (Swan and Ft Lowell) on the 4th Sunday. Six persons attended on July 24th.

Since we began meeting in-person on June 12th, we're letting things settle down before we start thinking about additional advertising. Madeline continues to share our upcoming events through our Facebook page. Our regular Natural Awakenings ad includes our new Sunday location, beginning with the August edition, and a newsbrief describing our new location was created. We are getting some traction. Previous thoughts: Unscrewed theater, LTW playbill.

One prospective board member we discussed has taken the equivalent of Foundations elsewhere, and is a contributing member, so they are eligible. A second prospective board member was identified. Both will be asked, and, if interested, invited to our zoom board meetings.

Anyone else who is qualified (active, and actively supporting our Center with time, talent and treasure, having completed at least Foundations (or its equivalent), and preferably Visioning (doesn't have to have been here), able to pass a background check) and interested in serving on the CSLT Board is also invited to attend our regularly scheduled monthly board meetings.

8n. Annual Meeting Preparation. We'll need to have completed our Annual report by September 14th, and send out the invitations/reminders (postcards) to the members by September 9th. We will offer the possibility of an in-person gathering at the Office & Education Center starting at 11:30 on October 2 for those who prefer to gather in person, as well as zoom participation for those who are not local, or don't prefer to gather in person.

<u>Annual Report Preparation</u>: Rev Janis to send out previous year reports so that board members can see what we said last time and to ask board members for highlights that they think should be included in Maria's chair report (Aug 28), Rev Janis to receive any additional reports or comments from board members by Sept 7 which she will turn around quickly and ask for a review/comment/approval by Sept 14. Our Annual Report will be included in the newsletter on Sept 21st.
