On December 19, the Board approved transferring a large portion of our Facility Fund monies into a 15-month CD with Vantage West which pays out considerably more interest than we have seen anywhere else. That transfer was instituted by Janet and Maria on 12/19.

7a 911 S Craycroft facility update

Termite treatment work was completed on Dec 22, 2022. They said we might see ongoing activity while the chemicals do their work. We haven't seen anything.

7b. Live Theater Workshop (LTW) update

Live Theater Workshops is happy having us as renters. Our contract through May 2023 is in place. We noticed a slight increase in attendance when the use of masks became 'encouraged' rather than 'mandatory'. The Pima County Health Department (as of December 4) has recommended shifting back to recommending masks because the Covid infection rate has become concerning in recent days. Additionally, there seems to be other respiratory crud going around.

We began our first 4-week period of returning to zoom only on December 11 and remained on zoom (only) through January 1. Attendance dropped 50% during the four weeks we were on zoom only. This was disheartening, since it was the decision of the Sunday morning set up team to go virtual only.

8d Community & Growth

Credo: CSLT inspires spiritual expression in community with all and offers an accepting, loving, and peaceful way of living a joyful, healthier, and more abundant life.

CSLT Online Community Presence:

Zoom account: Presently CSLT uses two zoom accounts, one for Sundays and Rev Janis' classes, and one for everything else. In the interest of simplifying our online presence, does it make sense to reduce down to a single account? (We do not have multiple online activities occurring that would require two accounts.) Starting in February CSLT will use the 2nd Zoom link and the password will be changed to 888888.

YouTube: The recordings of our online services continue to be viewed on YouTube. We also live-stream our complete Sunday service on YouTube (with between 3-5 views (average) during the live service), though we are only recording the talk and prayer, per our previous agreement with the band. There are now 148 subscribers to our site, up from 147. Our most watched service (later) was Sunday, December 11 with guest speaker Rev Veronica Silva, which had 29 views. The second most watched was December 18 with 25 views. We had 160 views last month totaling 9.4 hours. Both those numbers are lower than average. 66% of the views were by non-subscribers.

<u>Instagram</u>: As of this writing (January 4), we have 118 Instagram followers & 203 posts. If posting on Instagram is fun for you, contact the office to join the Instagram team.

Newsletter Statistics: Four newsletters were sent during December to between 530-533 subscribers. Between 253 & 270 people (49-52%) opened them, and 16-24% of those who opened the emails clicked on something for further reading. While our open rate, and click-through rate, are slightly down for us, we remain well above average for our industry. Truly exceptional readership and participation rates.

Morning Meditation. Daily practice continues. The current leaders have agreed to continue the daily morning practice through March 2023. We know that those participating get good value from the practice, and we/they are open to having others join in as they feel intrigued and called.

8e Covid 19 Live Theatre Workshop has protocols in place which we abide by. As a new facility, built during the pandemic, they have the volume and quality of air handlers which reduce risks to humans. Masks are encouraged, not mandatory.

People are encouraged to distance as they feel the need. We augment their practices with color-coded nametags (green = hugs ok, yellow = ask me first, red = no contact, please).

8f Small Groups

Prosperity Mastermind Group continue to meet online. The group continues to meet 1st and 3rd Sundays 1pm in our second zoom room. New graduates invited to participate. Five people regularly attend. Good results are being achieved.

Men's Group, which was begin in 2014(!) meets twice monthly in person, with some participants joining the conversation from a shared zoom room.

Janet Salese hosts **Full Moon Labyrinth Walk** as a regular activity for which we advertise and encourage participation of those interested. The December walk had 10 participants. The January 6th walk was led by Robie Jean Chandler with assistance from Shelly Dunn. There were a total of 10 participants, half of which were new.

Sacred Cinema – The October movie was "The Shack", available on Netflix. It was attended by 3 persons. Cinema is taking a break for November and December and returns on January 15th (3rd Sunday) @ 2pm with "I Can Only Imagine", available on Amazon Prime, YouTube Primetime and Redbox.

Lunch Bunch -- Madeline hosts a regular gathering at Basha's food court (Swan and Ft Lowell) the 4th Sunday of each month. Lunch Bunch is skipping December's meeting because the 4th Sunday is the 25th, we're still on zoom, and few places are open for lunch anyway. The January gathering will be after services on the 22nd.

Madeline continues to share our upcoming events through our Facebook page. Nothing more at this time. Rev Janis continues to post up to 5 events in Natural Awakenings each month. The deadline for uploading events and activities is the 10th of the previous month. (January 2023 events were uploaded by Dec 10.)

CSL is also in the process of selling the building in Golden Co as we no longer have a need for it. Rev Kathy Mastraianni gave an update on our SOM Archive where we are preserving our history. 
