## 8d Community & Growth

**Credo:** CSLT inspires spiritual expression in community with all and offers an accepting, loving, and peaceful way of living a joyful, healthier, and more abundant life.

## **CSLT Online Community Presence**:

Zoom account: There is one CSLT Zoom account. On Sunday there are an average of 11 participants. YouTube: The recordings of our online services continue to be viewed on YouTube. We also live-stream our complete Sunday service on YouTube (with between 3-5 views (average) during the live service), though we are only recording the talk and prayer, per our previous agreement with the band. We now have 165 subscribers up from 161. Our most watched service in February was Rev. Janis' Feb 26 farewell reminder with 38 views. The second most watched was Feb 5 with 32 views. There was a total of 126 views for February, which was a decrease from January's 307 views. The watch time was 25.5 hours (down 22.7 in January).

<u>Instagram</u>: As of February 16, we have 122 Instagram followers (up 4 from January) & 209 posts. Could not get on from home computer to update. If posting on Instagram is fun for you, contact the office to join the Instagram team.

**Newsletter Statistics**: Four newsletters were sent during February to between 536-538 subscribers. Between 268-285 people (51-54%) opened them, and 16-26% of those who opened also clicked on something for further reading. There were 3 more subscribers in February. Our open rate, and click-through rate, decreased slightly from January to between 274-312 people (52-59%) opened them, and 17-42% of those who opened also clicked on something for further reading.

**Morning Meditation**. Daily practice continues. The current leaders have agreed to continue the daily morning practice through March 2023. We know that those participating get good value from the practice, and we/they are open to having others join in as they feel intrigued and called.

**8e Covid 19** Live Theatre Workshop has protocols in place which we abide by. Masks are encouraged, not mandatory. People are encouraged to distance as they feel the need. We augment their practices with color-coded nametags (green = hugs ok, yellow = ask me first, red = no contact, please).

**Prosperity Mastermind Group** continue to meet online. The group continues to meet 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays 1pm on Zoom. New graduates invited to participate. Five people regularly attend. Good results are being achieved.

**Men's Group**, which was begun in 2014(!) meets twice monthly in person, with some participants joining the conversation from a shared zoom room.

Janet Salese hosts **Full Moon Labyrinth Walk** as a regular activity for which we advertise and encourage participation of those interested. Rev Janis' last Sunday reminder is February 26<sup>th</sup>. The upcoming speakers are March 12 Rev Rhonda Tretsven, March 19 - Rev Jeff Hargis, March 26 - Rev Dr. Kathy Hearn, April 2 - Cerise Patron, April 9 (easter) - our own Sharon Whealy, RScP, Apr 16 - Rev Joyce Holley, Apr 23 - Rev Tracey Harrick.

Sharon also continues to support our Center with Sunday morning meditations and platform twice each month. She also routinely covers 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday platform and meditation and hosts a monthly gratitude rainshower. Maria Schuchardt offers the Sunday Morning Meditation and platform on the 1st Sunday each month, and then platform duties 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday. Tamara Morrison continues to provide the pre-service meditation on 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday. We remain grateful for this continuing support.

Daily morning meditation practice (on zoom) continues. Madeline has assumed oversight of this group. Committed volunteers, and committed attendees continue to support it. New people join intermittently and are welcomed.

**EDUCATION CORE** Submitted by Maria Schuchardt

Maria and Mariann began an 8-week book study on Ernest *Holmes' A New Design for Living* beginning Feb 7<sup>th</sup>. **It** will end on March 28. Ethel Lee Miller led a book group on *Braving the Wilderness* by Brené Brown.

10 participants. (1 auditing). 3 Zoom sessions (270 minutes total) for a book exploration.

Explore: to inquire or discuss in detail. I chose "book exploration" to be able to encourage self-inquiry and opportunities for self-discovery. *Braving the Wilderness* addresses ways to build the habit of bravery to live one's personal values, claim and use personal boundaries with confidence. Homework was to read the book and be prepared for exploring several chapters each week.

Participants were very interested and cooperative at our first session sharing in breakout rooms and telling reactions and experiences re the elements in BRAVING: BOUNDARIES, RELIABILITY, ACCOUNTABILITY, VAULT, INTEGRITY, NONJUDGMENT, AND GENEROSITY. This led to personal examples of courage and heroes. Personalizing the concepts was encouraged through voluntary sharing of personal writing and in the rolling chats the whole group created. I felt the first session also served to form a *trustworthy group* of people with a common interest. The second and third sessions continued the book exploration with what I sensed as more open self-identification and sharing writing and personal experiences with the whole group, breakout rooms, and more rolling chats, which in itself was pretty brave.

We concluded our last session with creation of a personal permission slip or slips of new ways to be brave. I saw the conclusion of the book group as just the beginning of deeper personal exploration for all of us. I enjoyed facilitating this CSLT class very much.
