6b Payment on 22nd Street property CSLT received a \$47,479 payment on the property on 22 nd Street that			
was sold, the money was deposited into the Chase Bank facility fund then transferred to Vantage West			
Credit Union (VW). Funds were added from VW Gen Ops to open a \$50,000 CD. It will mature or	i January 3,

6c CD Account A CD account was opened on December 19, 2022 with \$100,000 for at Vantage West Credit Union has yielded \$2,000. The monthly interest is being transferred by the bookkeepers to the VW General Ops account, while the principle Facility Fund money remains intact and preserved. This CD matures in March 19, 2024.

6d Facility Fund Janet will work with the bookkeeper to get the Facility Fund updated. At this point it does not reflect what is in the accounts.

6e Education Fund The bookkeepers closed out the Education Fund and the funds were put in Vantage West General ops account. Janet will have them moved to Chase Bank General Ops account, or Vantage West Additional Savings so that it will be separate from our General Ops account at Vantage West that is used for day to day expenses. It will be kept as reserve money.

6f Budget Janet and Maria looked at the budget for the upcoming year on June 30. Janet made a draft budget in early July. The current budget will end in August, and the new budget will start September 1. Prices are going up 10 – 15%. The major change for the upcoming budget is the salaries that will be paid. Based on a new minister coming in February 2024 and administrative assistant being hired in March 2024 the cost will put CSLT in a deficit of \$32,000. One suggestion is to pay off the office and suspend the charitable giving at the end of the year when our commitment is complete. Ten percent of our income will still go to home office. A decision to pay off the mortgage on the office will have to be discussed with the new minister. A big expense is the copier, Janet will speak with the Copy people in August. The contract for the copier goes to August 2024. There was no objection to the new budget being submitted to the bookkeepers.

6g Conscious Giving & Offerings in service Congregation needs to be informed that it takes funds to run the center. Decided to think about how to best communicate conscious giving. Manifesting increased contributions, YESING this is an abundant universe.

6h Operating expenses In 2023, the average monthly deficit is \$1,800.

6i Credit Card Machine The credit card machine is costing over \$110 a month. With a cell phone a Square reader could be purchased and wouldn't need the credit card machine.

6j Cell phone On June 25 it was determined that a hotspot does not provide enough bandwidth for Zoom and YouTube. Zoom video freezes, but the sound is good. YouTube seems to be running well. A new cell phone will be purchased for using Square Reader for credit card purchases. Janet and Maria will go shopping.

6k Welcome Home Janet The banking and bills were done by Maria. Chris and Mariann set up new computer and spoke with Go Daddy.

7a 911 S Craycroft facility update The weeds are under control, yet will need spraying after the rains. Recycling is done on every other Thursday morning. Chris will put the recycling bin out to the curb when necessary. Janet and Maria cleaned parts of the office on July 8. There will be another cleaning day on Saturday, August 19. It was determined the plates, silverware, glasses will remain.

7b. Live Theater Workshop (LTW) / Sunday Service It is important for LTW to sign in as host (CSLT admin) and have Susan be co-host. There are streaming issues (see 6h) and we are looking for ways to increase the quality of our online presence. The Zoom quality is still and issue. The video of the service sometimes goes black, and when it works it is choppy. The audio is good. We are offering color-coded nametags (green = hugs ok, yellow = ask me first, red = no contact, please).

7c Hack update It was decided to not move forward with Go Daddy's proposal for extra security. Passwords will be upgraded and changed regularly. They will be kept on the green thumb drive. Admin email needs to be checked and changed if necessary. Constant Contact password has been changed by Mariann. Mariann and Janet will go to the office after service on July 30 to look at computer passwords, and new computer. Financial communication addresses need to be further updated to a more secure link. The communication email will return to a "tucsoncsl" email address.

7d New Computer and plan for updates Chris suggested the new computer has sufficient memory to update the software as the computer is being used. It will be determined when that will be.

April's New Designated Monies reflects increase in investments. The decrease in the VWCU Facility Fund account was payment for duct repair at office building. 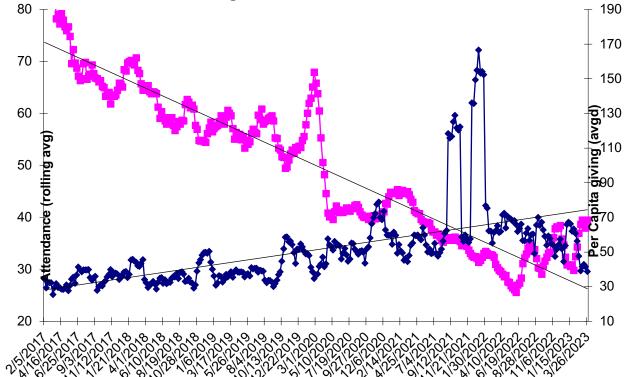
